The Madison-Champaign ESC Governing Board is conducting a search for a new superintendent. The vacancy is the result of the retirement of Dr. Daniel R. Kaffenbarger.

About the Madison-Champaign ESC

The Madison-Champaign ESC is one of 51 service centers in the state of Ohio serving 9 local school districts and two Career Technical Centers in West Central Ohio. The Service Center has experienced steady growth in their programs and services over the past decade. MCCESC provide a wide array of services with its primary focus on children with exceptional needs. The service providers of the agency affect students in preschool through 12th grade. The ESC also provides a curricular support and professional development through the Teaching and Learning Teams.

Leadership Criteria

The Governing Board is seeking a candidate who can continue to build on the Servant Leadership model that has defined the agency over the past decade. The incoming superintendent should be a person of integrity, one who is willing to put the needs of others above their own. The next leader should be a skilled communicator and a compassionate collaborator with both internal and external stakeholders. Ideally the candidate will have keen foresight and the ability to

think systematically about the diverse programs and services offered by the ESC.

Candidate Qualifications:

- *Must hold an Ohio Superintendent license.
- *Possess a strong administrative background in public schools. Experience working with or for and educational service center is preferred.
- *Experience as a school administrator with superintendent, assistant superintendent or central office experience preferred.
- *Commitment to the highest personal and professional standards.
- *Values and demonstrates principles of servant leadership in their work in the agency.
- *A comprehensive understanding of Ohio school law, finance and regulations, and financial reporting.
- *Self-starting skills who has the ability to think and plan strategically.
- *Keen business management skills with the ability to anticipate the needs of partner school districts.
- *The ability to work as an articulate, straightforward communicator with strong interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to work with governing board members, administrators, staff, students, parents, both county communities and elected officials.
- *Visionary and strong multi-tasking skills, with the ability to organize and synthesize information efficiently, which produces short- and long-range plans for continuous improvement.
- *Personal integrity with the ability to build collaborative relationships with partner districts and within the ESC.
- *The ability to balance the needs of the ESC with the needs of its partner districts.
