FRANKLIN B. WALTER ALL-SCHOLASTIC AWARD SELECTION PROCESS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICE CENTERS (ESCs)

Districts submit the student to the ESC – the ESC is responsible for reviewing the applications and selecting a winner based on the rubric below.

Each application consists of **three** sections:

APPLICATION SECTION (To Be Completed by Student)

- a) Application form completed by student
- b) Essay with goal statement of the student

CREDENTIAL SECTION (To Be Completed by Guidance Counselor)

- a) Transcripts of first seven semesters of school
- b) Number of days missed
- c) ACT/SAT scores
- d) Grade point average
- e) Class rank

REVIEWER SECTION (To Be Completed by ESC Reviewers)

Each application must be read and rated by at least three different reviewers. After the reviewer has read and rated each of the areas, the reviewer must initial the application.

All applications should be evaluated according to the following scale and using the attached rubric. A perfect score for all areas will be 100 points.

Extracurricular Activities	Up to 10 points	
Awards and Recognitions	Up to 10 points	
Essay	Up to 50 Points	
TOTAL SCORE	Up to 100 points
